During its first operational phase (July 1999 – December 2002), EMWIS has build solid foundations at the organisational level as well as for raising awareness of Med Partner Countries about the interest of the necessary sharing of information and of developing National Water Information Systems (NWIS). EMWIS is now in the mid-term of its contractual second phase with the support from the European Commission, France, Italy and Spain (Dec'03-Nov'06).

Today, EMWIS has 20 National Focal Points (NFP), 15 have published their web site on the Internet. These sites are offering a homogenous access to the available information on water in the concerned countries.
