From Tegel Airport

- 1. At the airport terminal you should follow the signs towards bus station.
- 2. Tickets can be bought from machine and I guess from the driver as well
- 3. From Tegel airport you have two options

A.

Ride the bus TXL in the direction S+U Alexanderplatz, you should leave the bus at the station S+U Berlin Hauptbahnhof the journey takes 20min.

From the station S+U Berlin Hauptbahnhof take the bus 245 in the direction of S Nordbahnhof/Gartenstr leave the bus at the station U Naturkundemuseum the journey takes 4min.

B.

Ride the bus 128 in the direction U Osloer Str, you should leave the bus at the station U Kurt-Schumacher-Platz the journey takes 9min.

From the station U Kurt-Schumacher-Platz take the underground U6 in the direction of U Alt-Mariendorf leave the bus at the station U Naturkundemuseum the journey takes 10min.

The hotel Ramada Berlin mitte located around 200m from the station.

From Schönefeld Airport

- 1. At the airport terminal you should follow the signs towards S station (a kind of internal train).
- 2. Tickets can be bought from the machine. At the machine write the destination Berlin then write S+U Friedrichstr. Bhf, pay and pick your ticket
- 3. Go to the platform for one of these trains (RB14 direction Nauen, Bahnhof) or (RE7 direction Bad Belzig, Bahnhof). The journey takes 24min.
- 4. You should leave the train at the station S+U Friedrichstr. Bhf.
 This station is two sections S for trains and U for underground. You should go to the underground section and take U6 in the direction U Alt-Tegel
- 5. Leave U6 at the station U Naturkundemuseum. The journey is 3min (2 stations only).

The hotel Ramada Berlin mitte located around 200m from the station.

Important notes

Single Tickets requiring validation must be validated immediately on starting travel.

Within the two-hour validity of the Single Ticket you may change trains/buses, etc. or interrupt your journey as often as you wish.

Return and round trips are not permitted. Return trips are journeys in the direction of the starting point on the same line as on the outward journey.

Round trips are journeys in which a different route from the outward trip is used

- to reach the starting point
- to a point near this
- to a destination which could have been reached with the outward journey
